Should it be PAYG orfunded? - Recently Prof. Noriyuki Takayama's research group released a report on financing pensions, atopic of world-widedebate.

Ithasbeen pointed out in Japan andelsewherethatthe PAYG system will face financial difficulties. In reaction to such debates, the World Bank putforward a new funded systemin1994.Eversince,financingpensionshasbeena hot topic among pension experts and international organizations but according to the said report, there is a growing consensus that financially speaking, funded and conventional PAYG schemes are essentially not so different. This is because investment performance of the funded reserve will ultimately become restricted by demographic or financial situations. Further, during the transition periodthecurrentworking generation must bear a twiceburden.

The point of focus has thus moved from financial to politicalaspects. Thereport thenfocusesonanewsystem of the *notional* defined contribution plan, the Swedish model. "It is better than the parametric reforms of the Japanese system. In the NDC, rules are set including thoseonhowtorevisethesystem, thus wining more trust of the participants." (Prof. Takayama)

According to the survey released by the Ministry of Health, Labor andWelfare earlier this month, 80% of over 60 years old are satisfied with the current pension system whereas 40% of under 30 years old are against it. Increasing attention ispaidtopensionstudies.
