



Figure 1 Federal elderly benefits, single seniors, 1985







Figure 4 Change in federal elderly benefits, single seniors, current (2000) versus old (1985) systems




Figure 5 Change in federal elderly benefits, as % of income, single seniors, current (2000) versus old (1985) systems





Figure 6 Elderly benefits for single senior, current system and proposed Seniors Benefit, 2001



other income (\$000)






Figure 8 Gains and losses from proposed Seniors Benefit, single seniors, 2001




Figure 9 Gains and losses from proposed Seniors Benefit, as % of other income, single seniors, 2001




Figure 10 Gains and losses from proposed Seniors Benefit, one-income couples, 2001




Figure 13 Gains and losses from proposed Seniors Benefit, as % of other income, two-income couples, 2001




Figure 14 Elderly benefits expenditures (OAS/GIS/SPA) as % of GDP, 1952-2100





Figure 15 Marginal tax rates, single seniors living in Ontario, current system and proposed Seniors Benefit, 1997



-current system - Seniors Benefit




Figure 12 Gains and losses from proposed Seniors Benefit, two-income couples, 2001
